Section 1: Rationale (Approx 100 words)	
<p>On my course, I have learnt new skills in planning, editing and creating different media products (audio; video). I have also developed directorial skills. On a personal level, I have developed my communication skills and I can confidently express my ideas when working in groups.</p> <p>These skills will help me create a successful product, as it is imperative that you are aware of what ideas you want to carry forward into production.</p> <p>I need to improve my understanding of cinematography to better the visual elements of my project.</p> <p>My idea is unique as I intend to combine documentary style with fantasy. It appears that none of the SHAFF film entries has explored the fantasy aspects of storytelling.</p>	
Section 2: Project Concept (Approx 200 words)	
<p>My concept for the adventure film project will follow a man with the ability to open up gateways to different locations. He chooses to explore the English countryside and embrace the wide-open spaces to feel at one with his abilities without others seeing. It will last for five-to-six minutes at the most.</p> <p>I aim for this product to influence younger audiences to visit the Peak District more often. For research, I will look at several different films (Documentary Style Adventure/Fantasy). These are very specific to my proposed idea meaning that the research into them will relate to my final major project as well as support its development.</p> <p>In terms of resources, I will be using the DSLR camera and a large tri-pod to shoot the film. I will also use the Morantz kit with a shotgun microphone and a boom pole to capture all audio.</p> <p>I will make use of tutorial by dedicating my spare time to planning and gathering resources. I will begin creating an equipment list, shot list and a risk assessment.</p> <p>When given peer feedback, I would consider the constructive criticism and adapt my idea so that it avoids problems raised. In terms of independent study, I will take this opportunity to watch as many films, relevant to my chosen genre.</p>	
Section 3: Evaluation (Approx 150 words)	
<p>When reflecting on the progression of my project, I will use my reflective journal and add to it on a weekly basis. I will discuss any issues raised and their outcomes. I will be thorough with regards to what is covered and continue to observe my progression as I work along.</p> <p>Rather than a vlog, I will simply add small entries to the reflective journal with comments explaining the changes to ideas. When drawing a conclusion, I will refer to targets I had set prior to production.</p> <p>I will discuss what was successful and what needed improving and go further as to mention how much of the final product matched my earlier ambitions.</p>	

In the evaluation, I will make sure I analyze the entire process from pre-production through to postproduction and reference any influences I had.

I will be sure to comment on working with others and the impacts that they had on my final piece. I will also comment on any disruptions and how I had/could have avoided them.

Section 4: Proposed Research Sources and Bibliography (Harvard Format)

Primary Research: In terms of primary research, I will select a collection of adventure and fantasy films. I will then circulate the entire classroom to see how many people enjoy one or the other and how many prefer a mix of the two genres. This will be presented as a single sheet of paper with tick boxes for each student to complete.

Along with it, a list of films which fall under the two significant genres. (Adventure/Fantasy) I will also create a survey, using SurveyMonkey, which I will share via social media. It will delve deeper into obtaining qualitative research as well as quantitative research.

Secondary Research: In terms of secondary research, I will look to the Internet to locate the most successful fantasy films and then begin picking out qualities from each of them to help adapt them to my individual project.

I may even look to reading sections of fantasy novels to determine a difference between the film adaptations and the original texts. After which, I will be able to determine the methods I will use to, effectively, tell the story I proposed, to my target audience.
